

Black drum (Pogonias cromis) – Clams, shrimp, crab, sand fleas






Black margate (Anisotremus surinamensis) – Shrimp, squid or cut bait

Crevalle jack (caranx crysos) — Most all baits, most all artificials








Dog snapper (Lutjanus jocu) — live baits, jigs, spoons, feathers, plugs, or pork ring. Photo submitted by Gage T Pollard






Gafftopsail catfish (Bargre marinus) — live baits, crabs, shrimp prawns, crustaceans. Photo submitted by Gretchen Barota

Mutton snapper (Lutjanus analis) — squid, ballyhoo, crabs, shrimp — photo contribution from Justin Collett, Melbourne








Nurse shark (Ginglymostoma cirratum) — squid, stingray, crab, sea urchins – *photo contribution from Natalie Neuman-Kasper*



Palometa (Trachinotus goodei) — Sand fleas, clams, shrimp










Pompano (Trachinotus carolinus) — sand fleas, clams, shrimp

Sand Perch (Diplectrum formosum) — Benthic crustaceans, including shrimps, crabs, and amphipods, as well as small fishes such as small sea bass.





Schoolmaster snapper (Lutjanus apodus) — live shrimp, cut shrimp, cut bait and baitfish





Sheepshead (Archosargus probatocephalus) — Sand fleas, crab, clam, shrimp





Snook (Centropomus undecimalis) — Live baits, artificials











Spanish mackerel (Scomberomorus maculatus) — Small live bait, small artificials





Spot croaker (leiostomus xanthurus) — clams, shrimp, sand fleas
